

Louis Pasteur Is Honored by Paris Savants

PARIS, Dec. 26.—The centenary of the birth of Louis Pasteur was observed today by the Academy of Medicine with exercises in honor of the world-famous chemist and biologist, one of the academy's most illustrious members. Pasteur was elected to the academy in 1873 as a free associate, not being eligible to regular membership as he was neither a physician nor an apothecary.

Dr. Albert Calmette, assistant of the Pasteur Institute, said that if a 15-year-old subject in the middle of the last century had the expectation of living thirty-six years, whereas today his life expectation was forty-eight, it was very largely due to Pasteur's discoveries and achievements.
